MARCHING ORDERS SEPT 2021


Having launched the Regimental Series in March 2019 and the Axial Series in August of the same year, the British Drum Company Marching Division was firing on all cylinders and ready to roll... that was until the world was hit by a global pandemic and we were forced by the government to stop production, close the doors and lock up the factory. In May this year we reopened our doors and the production lines started to flow again. This is not how I expected to start off my first marching blog for British Drum Co!

For those of you who do not know me, let me introduce myself. My name is Stu Warmington and I have the distinct pleasure of being the Manager for the Marching Division here at BDC HQ. I spent 22 years in the Corps of Drums of Her Majesty's Royal Marines and was extremely lucky enough to meet some amazing people along my journey, as well as getting the opportunity to perform in some amazing venues all over the world. I can only describe it as a paid hobby, however it was due to that job that led me to BDC. (That's a story for another blog!)

We have two series of drums in the marching division. The first is the <u>Regimental Series</u> which is our range of traditional marching drums. These have been taken on by the <u>Royal Marines</u> and the British Army, as well as many bands in the UK, Europe & China.



The <u>Axial Series</u> is our Pipe band range and was co-designed with BDC and our International Marching Specialist, <u>Jim Kilpatrick</u>. Over the past 18 months, the Axial Series drums have been despatched to the UK, Europe, USA, Australia and New Zealand, to name but a few countries, and have been taken on by Grade 1 Police Scotland & Federation Pipe Band (formally <u>Glasgow Police</u>). We have also attracted a plethora of <u>marching artists</u> to join our BDC artist family.

Product Updates

Regimental Series

Innovation is at the heart of everything we do at British Drum Co. We have been working closely with the Corps of drums of Her Majesty's Royal Marines as they use our RS1 snare drums, gaining insights as to how we could improve and develop our instruments to be certain we are on top of our game. The first result of this collaboration is the new top snare mechanism which will appear in all RS1 & RS1C drums moving forward. Precision



engineered using the highest-grade components, this new streamlined mechanism offers a more efficient user experience that is easy to use and inspires confidence in the player.

After all, in the world of marching drums, if you're not moving forward, you're just standing still!



Axial Series

The pandemic has caused many supplies issues for companies across the world and we're no different. Earlier this year one of our supplies went under so we had to reassess our situation. While we'd already started working on new ideas this was the ideal time to bring them forward 12 months. The biggest visual change will be for the tenor and bass drums.

The <u>claws</u> have changed to compliment the X-Frames on the snare drums. The new claws are made from steel and have a wider mass area to help give a more even tension across the hoops.

<u>Georgian Oak hoops</u> will come as standard on both tenor and bass drums and feature our new head

stress management system which sees the metal flesh hoop of the drumhead completely disappear from view. The new design massively strengthens the hoop as it now has a metal ring inside due to the drumhead flesh hoop. The bass drum also features a <u>chamfered edge</u> thus giving it a smaller profile.

The <u>Regimental Practice Pad</u> is a 10" practice pad with premium high-grade silicone playing surface for clear, articulate stick response.






Tower of London



Moving forward through September and October we have a busy time ahead as September see us sponsoring and attending the Society of International Rudimental Drummers Symposium.

We also have more "On The Sofa with..." videos penciled in the diary to record and the launch of the new finishes for 2022/23 sees us updating the website in the new few weeks.

The World Pipe Band Championships 2022

After a 2 year hiatus the World Pipe Band Championships eventually took place once again on the famous Glasgow Green. Over 40,000 people attended the event over the 2 days with 146 bands taking part. A lot has happened since the Axial Series launched at the last championships in 2019. This year the BDC marquee was bigger and a lot busier than last time - in fact it was the biggest structure on the field. It had to be - we had over 40 drums on display!

The event saw us launch the new finishes for 22/23 including the much talked about Exo-Skins. This allows the user to change the look of their drum by applying the Exo-Skins to the X-Frames on the snare drums. There are two design options with a total of 12 different colour finishes for each design.

As player of our Axial drums we were lucky enough to have <u>Brisbane Boys' College Pipe Band</u> & <u>Police Scotland & Federation Pipe Band</u> play in front of the marquee to entertain the masses and after many requests we even managed to get all the BDC artists together for a jam with the Drum Corps from Police Scotland and Federation.

We had many guests pop in throughtout the 2 days including Mark Reilly who managed a quick jam with <u>Gareth</u> & <u>Steven</u> (more about Mark later on in the blog) as well as <u>The Big Rab Show</u> team who popped in to see what we'd been up to since the last time we met. This year BDC bought its merchandise stand along so that combined with the <u>Jim Kilpatrick shop</u> meant we had a vey busy tent to say the least.

It also seemed popular with the <u>Sons of Holyland</u>





























<u>Pipe Band</u> as they were able to buy souvenirs to take back with them after their incredible journey to the their first World Championships.

This year we also had the BDC VIP Area. This was an area for friends and BDC artists to chill out and get away from it all. It also provided a great place to chat to people in a quieter environment. Being a BDC artists meant that all food and drinks were provided and ice cold water was definitely in high demand during the sweltering hot temperatures.

We also had the guys in from <u>Duncan Taylor</u>
<u>Whiskey</u> who were providing drams of <u>Black Bull</u>

entire event was a huge success and believe it or
not we've already planned out what we're doing for
next years event.


